FALL 2015 AND THE YEAR IN REVIEW

2015 Success, Art Market Growth and Auction Records

The year 2015 has been an exciting one for the art market and for Heffel Fine Art Auction House. We have seen records shattered,

At Heffel, we feel privileged to participate in the growth of the international art market and to share sought-after masterpieces with the public as they pass through one set of hands to the next.

On November 26, Heffel held the highestgrossing fine art auction in Canadian history, as 157 important works were offered at our semi-annual live auction. Starring museumquality works by Group of Seven artist Lawren Harris, the international auction achieved monumental sales of \$23.5 million, more than doubling presale estimates of \$10 million to \$15 million. Strong competition for major masterpieces from bidders across North America, Europe and Asia resulted in the sale of six individual works for more than \$1 million each.

Esteem for the work of Lawren Harris has gathered incredible momentum this year,

as an exhibition at the Hammer Museum in Los Angeles, California continues to garner deserved recognition for the artist. The Idea of North: The Paintings of Lawren Harris, cocurated by actor, musician and art-lover Steve Martin, made global headlines and brought the Group of Seven artist into the international spotlight. Harris led the fall auction with the sale of three works, totalling an astounding \$9,381,000. The first of the two major canvases, Winter Landscape, broke the previous artist record, which stood only for a few minutes before the commanding Mountain and Glacier sold for \$4,602,000, setting a new artist world record for Harris. The painting became the second most valuable Canadian work of art ever sold at auction, and the most expensive Group of Seven or Canadian 20th century work sold at auction. Inclusive of the fall sale, Heffel has sold works by Lawren Harris at auction totalling \$63,869,893 (exclusive of Heffel private sales).

Displaying both the directness and mystery characteristic of his strongest compositions, Alex Colville's *Harbour*, a rare self-portrait, was the leading lot and catalogue cover of the Post-War & Contemporary session of the fall auction. Spirited bidding drove this stunning work past the million dollar mark to realize a final price of \$1,888,000, exceeding its estimate and setting a new world record for a Colville work at auction.

Celebrating 20 Years of Live Auctions

The fall 2015 live auction marked an important milestone for Heffel, as we celebrated two decades of conducting live auctions. When

David Heffel and Robert Heffel launched the live auction platform in 1995, they quickly realized a one million dollar sale. Now, 20 years later, Heffel has sold 52 individual works for more than \$1 million and we are quickly approaching half a billion dollars in total art sales.

The growth of the art market is reflected in the history of our company. Kenneth Heffel founded our gallery business in 1978, at a time when it took nearly 12 months to reach \$4 million in sales. In today's market, Canadian art has appreciated in value tremendously, and it now can take only seven minutes to sell one painting, a Lawren Harris masterpiece, for more than \$4 million.

Heffel is the first auction house in Canada to split historical and contemporary Canadian art into separate sales: Post-War & Contemporary Art and Fine Canadian Art. We are proud to say that Heffel holds the highest art auction success rate in Canada, and sales are continuing to grow, providing further indication that that the art market remains strong.

Heffel Welcomes International Contemporary Live Auction Consignments

While works by Canadian-born artists are increasingly admired and acquired around the world, so too are Canadian buyers appreciative of and eager for a broad range of contemporary artwork. This year, Heffel welcomed international consignments to the live auction, expanding our Post-War & Contemporary Art catalogue to include important masters such as American Pop Art icon Roy Lichtenstein and British sculptor Barbara Hepworth. Internationally acclaimed Canadian-born artists such as Jean Paul Riopelle and Alex Colville also featured prominently in this season's sale. Recognizing the growing international interest for important contemporary works of art, Heffel's live auction catalogue will continue to include significant international works.

The highly anticipated contemporary works by internationally renowned artists were highlights in the fall auction. Roy Lichtenstein's *Modern Room* surpassed its presale estimate and set a new world record for this print at auction. On the heels of an acclaimed retrospective at the Tate Britain in London, England, British artist Barbara Hepworth also featured in the fall sale with a spectacular sculpture, *Three Forms (Three Horizontal Curves)*. Proceeds from the sale of this sculpture will benefit the Montreal Children's Hospital Foundation.

Live Auctions Break Sixteen Artist Records

This year's live auctions were particularly exciting as 16 new artist records were achieved between the spring and fall sales. In addition to the Lawren Harris and Alex Colville records, noteworthy artist records from the fall auction include William Kurelek's Our Carolers in Western Canada and Ivan Eyre's Red Rough.



annual live charity auction in Calgary with works from Imperial's collection. For the second year in a row, the lots on offer achieved a staggering 100 per cent success rate, resulting in Heffel's second "white glove" live auction. Imperial's net sale proceeds will benefit its United Way partners across Canada.

Expanded National Presence and Reaching a Global Audience

Our strong presence across Canada has solidified Heffel's place at the forefront of the Canadian art market, attracting veteran collectors and new buyers from coast to coast, as well as the United States, Europe and Asia.

In addition to our offices in Vancouver, Calgary, Toronto, Montreal and Ottawa, we are excited to share that this year we have expanded our offices in three cities, further allowing us to provide industry leading service to collectors. Our additional office space at 15 Hazelton Avenue in Toronto includes a new photography studio, a client conference room and a designated area for packing and shipping. This earned publicity reaches potential buyers from across Canada and in the international marketplace, garnering additional interest in our auctions. Coverage of our fall live auction was featured in significant Canadian news outlets such as the CBC, The Globe and Mail, Vancouver Sun and La Presse as well as international channels including the Los Angeles Times (USA), The Art Newspaper (UK and USA) and Art Market Monitor (USA).

As the undisputed Canadian leader in art at auction, it is a priority to reach current clients, potential consignors and prospective buyers. Through digital and traditional marketing initiatives we share happenings within Heffel, media coverage and industry news. We also remain engaged through our social

media platforms, including Twitter, Instagram and YouTube. In addition to monthly online auctions and monthly HO2 auctions, we hold two beautiful ballroom sales annually with expert, multi-lingual staff handling telephone and absentee bids for clients who are not able to attend or who would like to remain anonymous. Our live auctions are also live-streamed online and accessible on multi-platform web devices to allow those unable to attend to experience the energy in the auction room.


