# Spring 2015 in Review

## Emily Carr Receives Global Acclaim and Leads Spring Live Auction

Emily Carr once again led Heffel's spring live auction in Vancouver. Following its celebrated exhibition at the Dulwich Picture Gallery in London, England, *Emily Carr: From the Forest to the Sea* is now on view at Toronto's Art Gallery of Ontario. Relatively unknown outside of Canada prior to the exhibition, Carr's work has received glowing reviews from some of the most important art critics globally. It came as no surprise that the artist, who has seen overwhelming success at auction, stood out in this auction with seven highly anticipated works, totalling \$2.4 million. Leading the group was *Forest Light*, a rare mature~period canvas which had not been available for sale since its original acquisition from the artist in 1937 by well~known art collector and philanthropist, J.S. McLean. Inclusive of the spring auctions, Heffel has offered 244 works by Carr, totalling more than \$42 million in sales.

## Success in Canadian Post-War & Contemporary and Fine Canadian Art

As the industry leader, Heffel was the first auction house in Canada to split historical and contemporary Canadian art into separate sales; Canadian Post~War & Contemporary Art and Fine Canadian Art. The spring auction achieved a sales result of more than \$10 million, surpassing pre~sale estimates of \$7 to \$10 million. The Canadian Post~War & Contemporary Art session had sales totalling more than \$5.5 million, while the Fine Canadian Art session totalled more than \$4.5 million. Our May online auction sales added another \$776,013, bringing the combined total sales for 2015 so far to \$12,689,479.

We are proud to say that Heffel holds the highest auction success rate in the Canadian art industry and records are continuing to be achieved, providing further indication that the art market remains strong and robust.

#### Spring Live Auction Sets Six New Records

Adding to the significance of the live sale, six records were broken in the spring auction. The stunning Paul-Émile Borduas canvas *Chant d'été* shattered the artist record at a final price of \$737,500. The work was previously sold by Heffel in our spring 2011 live auction for \$409,500, marking a 15.72% annual rate of return or an 80% total return over four years, and showing a real thirst for great Canadian contemporary works of art.

Notable artist records were also achieved with Pierre Gauvreau's *Couchant corridor* and Duncan Ginaawaan's *Sea Bear*. Additionally, records were broken for artists in specific mediums with works by Ulysse Comtois, Borduas and Guido Molinari.

#### Supporting Canadian Art and Building Lasting Partnerships
