

Janet Echelman is an artist who defies categorization. She creates experiential sculpture at the scale of buildings that transform with wind and light. The art shifts from being an object you look at, to a living environment you can get lost in. Using unlikely materials from fishnet to atomized water particles, Echelman combines ancient craft with cutting-edge technology to create artworks that have become focal points for urban life on five continents. She was the recipient of the Guggenheim Fellowship, the Harvard University Loeb Fellowship, a Fulbright Lectureship, and the Aspen Institute Crown Fellowship. Her TED talk "Taking Imagination Seriously" has been translated into 35 languages with more than one million views. Ranked number one on Oprah Magazine's "List of 50 Things that Make You Say Wow!," she was named an Architectural Digest Innovator for "changing the very essence of urban spaces." Her most ambitious project to date, entitled "Skies Painted with Unnumbered Sparks", commemorated T45 feet above the walkway, street and water near the Convention Centre in Downtown Vancouver. It also featured an interactive light display, which could be choreographed by the public in real time. The project was co-presented by the Burrard Arts Foundation in collaboration with Google, Autodesk, and the City of Vancouver.



Rendered in pencil on black paper, Andrew Kent's painstakingly detailed seascapes flicker in and out of visibility as light catches on the reflective graphite surface. The viewer's bobbing, back-and-forth motion that causes the image to appear and disappear is reminiscent of the ebb and flow of tidal waters, and the shifting mutability of perception itself.

While the works effortlessly capture the mercurial ocean surface, their simplicity is deceiving – Kent describes his process as being "like a serious joke that takes a while to get to the punchline." By spending hours of careful work to capture a single moment, Kent both comments on the fleeting and unreliable nature of vision, and attempts to visually translate something intangible.

Kent has worked in sculpture, video and painting, but drawing retains a vital role in his practice, as he appreciates the intimate, immediate nature of works on paper. Kent's laborious approach to and investment in his drawings can be found throughout his practice. His series Eureka transcribed the Edgar Allen Poe poem of the same name on canvas, superimposing the words on top of themselves again and again until a field of nearly solid darkness was created, flecked by spots of bare canvas in a manner reminiscent of the night sky. The black seascapes share with his bodies of work the devotion of an intensive amount of creative labor to an ephemeral subject.

Scott Massey lives and works on Bowen Island, BC. Massey's work explores the confluence of art and science whereby he accentuates and amplifies natural phenomena, often heightened through artificial means or via slight manipulations, based on research into areas of physics, cosmology, astronomy, and other scientific disciplines. Light as a medium and image-making apparatus are fundamental aspects of his practice, employed in both the creation and presentation of works. His image-based artworks confound normal methodologies of the media, perhaps by inverting processes or corrupting the apparatus, and his sculptural works often employ a performative or durational element that further activates the work.

The Julian day system was introduced by astronomers to provide a single system of dates that could be used when working with different calendars and to unify different historical chronologies. Almost 2.5 million Julian days have elapsed since the initial epoch, January 1, 4713 BC.

This photograph was made at dawn on the turn of the millennium, a moment some believed would either be the end of the world, or at the least, a protracted moment of chaos globally as computer systems malfunctioned due to the Y2K scare. In the end, as usual, nothing happened. Yet even if some catastrophe did occur, this image serves to remind us that our disasters are ours alone and the rest of the planet probably doesn't care.

Scott Sueme is a Canadian artist raised in Vancouver, BC. Since attending Emily Carr University of Art + Design in 2006, Sueme has been working as a graphic artist and painter. Starting in the graffiti subculture, he has ventured personally and commercially through art, design, and installation painting.
