

In 1942, Alex Colville enlisted in the Canadian Armoured Corps, and in spring of 1944, he was assigned as an official Canadian war artist, one of a group of officers appointed to record the events of World War II. After training in England, he boarded the HMCS Prince David, and accompanied crew and commandos on exercises and raids into France and the Mediterranean. Colville's perspective of this scene is from the ship, and he included the nautical paraphernalia on its deck and a gun mount. The HMCS David lies at dock, in a peaceful pause from its war activities, and Colville captured this typical sunny day on the Mediterranean with a light, bright palette. The artist's mastery of watercolour is truly impressive in this finely detailed scene.

William Kurelek was exposed to the cultural traditions of the Ukrainian people throughout his life and captured them in his art with scrupulous detail. He devoted entire exhibitions and series of works to Ukrainian themes, and he took two trips to the Soviet Ukraine, in 1970 and 1977. He was deeply conscious of his ethnic roots and even after his conversion to Catholicism, continued to use Ukrainian Orthodox subjects in his art, although he stated that "One's Culture [sic] or nationality or ethnic origin is not the most important thing...Accordingly put God first, your ethnic origin second." In Kiev District Cemetery, we see a fresh grave decorated with sheaves of flowers from which black ribbons trail. A table nearby holds a dish, probably filled with water and left there for the soul of the deceased to refresh itself. The detail of the surrounding graveyard is exceedingly fine - from the metal crosses to the star atop a grave marker, Kurelek renders each symbol of his culture with careful, exacting respect.

Ron Martin was barely 25 years old in 1968 when The Heart of London, a survey exhibition of London, Ontario's contemporary art scene, exposed him to a national audience when it toured from Charlottetown to Victoria. Martin already had works in the collections of the London Public Library and Art Gallery (now Museum London), the National Gallery of Canada, the McIntosh Gallery (London, Ontario), and was beginning to produce works that engaged his oeuvre-defining questions of the what, when and how of making a painting.

Martin's art developed in leaps and bounds as attention grew. From the Conclusion and Transfer paintings (1967 - 1968) shown in The Heart of London through his most recent works exhibited in 2014, Martin produced series that structured his ambition to create a new work of art. They are discrete bodies that are neither serial, per se, nor repetitive. Their originality and lack of obvious cognates befuddle viewers, because his work confounds discussion in terms of art that has already been made, described and understood.

The earliest Black Paintings were done in 1973 after Martin concluded his One Colour paintings (1971 - 1973) and its well-known subset the Bright Red Paintings (1972). They were first exhibited at Toronto's Carmen Lamanna Gallery in June 1975, and defined new ground in Canadian abstract painting when artists were rejecting emphasis on the flatness of the picture plane, the central image and formalist preoccupation with composition in favour of paintings developed through procedural choice. Martin was among the most rigorous members of this leading edge. By using a determined colour, a determined amount of paint, a support of determined size, a determined orientation for the painting, and a determined presentation for the finished painting (unframed, and to be hung four to six inches from the floor), he sought to make works free from style.

The June 1975 Carmen Lamanna exhibition was well received by Gary Michael Dault in his review for The Toronto Star. In it, he calls Martin one of Canada's most important painters, and he considered the exhibition Martin's most important to date - applauding the paintings for their audacity and for Martin's willingness to forego complacency in favour of individual artistic development. Along with Guelph Trip – One & Two #17 that was purchased at the time by the consignor, the Lamanna exhibition had closely related paintings that were acquired by the Art Gallery of Ontario, the Canada Council Art Bank and the National Gallery of Canada.

Martin made arcs of paint with his hands by moving seven gallons of Mars Black paint across the canvas while it was on the floor . The incidental effects, suggesting a bas-relief's illusionistic depth, the raw expression associated with Abstract Expressionism, or specific cultural associations with black, are beside the point. Although they are there, it is most important to approach Guelph Trip – One & Two #17 as a painting to be looked at. Martin is interested in making art that allows the viewer to experience what they are as individuals during the process of looking deeply at his paintings. Because he believes art speaks to individuals, his self-imposed limits of size, colour, volume of paint, technique and presentation enable him to make paintings that confound those who ask, "what does it mean?" Hanging unframed, with the paint wrapping around the edges left visible, the painting is about as wide as the artist's outstretched arms, as high as his raised arms and hung so low on the wall it becomes a physical presence in its space. Standing before it, the viewer is confronted by another body, offering a chance for deeper contemplation and understanding.

Following his all-over mosaic paintings of the 1950s, space began to enter into Jean-Paul Riopelle's pictorial plane around 1960. A statement by Herta Wescher concerning his paintings of 1959 to 1960 noted this change: "The dense mosaics characteristic of his paintings of ten years ago have been broken up, allowing space to enter from all sides. Now, order and chaos intermingle; diagonals, curves and sharp hooks attack the verticals, voids are trapped at the heart of incredibly crowded centres." The brilliance of white brings open passages into this striking work, while squares and horizontal patches of inky black add magisterial weight. Riopelle has wielded the spatula vigorously, including some fine passages of mosaic knifework, which flash with scintillating reds, reminders of his stunning mosaic works of the 1950s. Titles at this time were connotative rather than a direct reference to content, and this one is evocative, translating as Full of Birds.

Riopelle's work was shown by important galleries during his career, and this painting was once handled by the prominent Pierre Matisse Gallery in New York.

Tony Scherman said in an interview: "If I'm out on the street or I'm in the subway and my eyes gaze over people, I can tell you that there is no period of time when my eye does not rest on something I find absolutely beautiful. It could be somebody's tie, a hand, a view, it could be a woman's face." Such appreciation for universal beauty is evident in this stunning still life. Scherman has remained interested in still lifes throughout his oeuvre, using everyday and historic objects and turning them into reflective and contemplative paintings. In this work, the peaches are preserved in their most perfect state - colourful, ripe and impeccably round - and surrounded by luscious grapes. As a master in the medium of encaustic, Scherman's subjects are illustrated with a rich vitality, both luminous and textural. He is also very well versed in art history, mythology and philosophy, often including references to such discourses in his work. Smith's visual meditations on the forest surrounding him on Vancouver's north shore have often included the delicate traceries of bare, slender branches and grasses that border the deeper coniferous forest. Their intertwining and criss-crossing creates a tapestry of line that pulls us to the surface and acts as a screen. This tangled skein delicately blocks us from entering, and contributes to the perception of the background as an abstract world of shape and colour, reinforced by patches of purple and golden brown which float in the picture plane. In Cypress Mountain, the carpet of snow makes the pattern of branches more visible, and creates an intermediate zone before the background of impenetrable growth. Within this square of canvas Smith gives us his perception of the mystery and vitality of the forest and a satisfying visual experience of a vital surface created by tactile paint, richness of palette and gestural line.

In the early 1990s Gordon Smith began a series of works based on pools. This painting is likely inspired by the small pond in his own backyard, with its reeds, lily pads and goldfish. Later, in 1995, Smith visited Claude Monet's famous home and garden at Giverny, and inspired by Monet's extraordinary water lily paintings, he developed this subject further in his lush and beautiful Pond series. Smith's command of expressionist brushwork, textural effects and the transitory effects of light are all at play in this fine example from this series. Smith moves back and forth between abstraction and representation, particularly in the surface of the water, which can be read both as water and as a flat, painterly field. Goldfish read as abstracted streaks of pigment, and the long, trailing stems resemble dripping, a device he often used in earlier landscapes. Such concerns reflect Smith's modernist approach, and how his awareness of the qualities of paint is just as important as the landscape that he depicts. Lyrical and sensual, Fish Pool - The Byway gives the viewer pleasure not only in its subject, but in its consummate painterly qualities.

After his first sojourn in France between 1891 and 1894, Marc-Aurèle de Foy Suzor-Côté left Canada for France a second time in 1897, residing there until 1907. Throughout these years, he attended the Julian and Colarossi Academies, traveled to Cernay, Normandy, Brittany, England and Scotland, and exhibited his work at the French Salons. The figure of the peasant became a common subject in Suzor-Coté's painting during this second French stay. As Laurier Lacroix stated, "the peasants inspired the artist to paint works in which the model assumes a moral role. The grandeur and the nobility of the subject makes it an archetype." In this work, a modest peasant woman of rural northern France is depicted sitting by a hearth where a fire is burning. Her posture and facial expression, marked by years of labour and harsh conditions of living, convey a sense of strength and dignity that commands respect. During a time of profound cultural change for the Haida people on British Columbia's northwest coast, their artistic traditions and narratives were preserved in the work of master carver Charles Edenshaw. Edenshaw survived the smallpox epidemic, and the depredations on the Haida way of life that occurred after the arrival of Europeans, including missionaries. Edenshaw's deep understanding of Haida myth was expressed through classic two-dimensional forms in a plethora of objects such as bracelets, spoons, bowls, platters, chests, headresses and totem poles, variously produced in argillite, silver, wood and gold. His work shows a sophisticated command of space, in which negative space balances defined shapes that elegantly interwine within the limitations of the chosen form. Edenshaw's fine, sinuous use of line was an identifying characteristic of his work, and it is a pleasure to examine his engraving in his bracelets and other items such as spoons.

Edenshaw produced work not just for the Haida, but also for other First Nations people, as well as for sale to tourists and anthropologists. The legacy of his work can also be seen in his descendents, such as esteemed artists Bill Reid and Jim Hart. His work continues to garner accolades in exhibitions such as the 2010 show at the UBC Museum of Anthropology (Signed Without Signature: Works by Isabella and Charles Edenshaw) and the 2013 show of his work at the Vancouver Art Gallery.

Smoking was introduced to the Haida by the Euro-American explorers, whalers and traders who arrived on the Northwest Coast at the end of the eighteenth century. Once the Hudson's Bay Company was established there, it imported and sold clay pipes. Seeing this, the Haida took up carving argillite pipes, ranging from plain to complex, often combining Euro-American figures with stylized animals. In this and lot 160, the bowl is fully formed and could have been used for smoking. The bowls often took the form of a human head, as do both these lots. According to Peter Macnair and Alan Hoover, the production of these pipes flourished during the two or three decades following 1850. These early trade pipes are finely carved and both feature bone elements. The stylized animals and the carved faces on the figures and human heads on the bowls are strong and expressive. Exquisite works such as this, which show the Haida's interest in other cultures appearing on their shores, are rare to the market.

The city of Winchester fashioned some of the earliest standardized systems of measurement used throughout the United Kingdom and France in the 18th century. This rare, immaculately preserved example of a Dry Measure Winchester, or Corn Measure, was produced in England for use in preconfederation Canada to regulate the sales of grains, seeds, salt, spices and flour. To mark its authenticity, the engraving on the side reads "G.R. Lower Canada 1795." The Latin initials G.R. represent "Georgius Rex" in reference to the contemporaneous British king, George IV. On the reverse, the engraving "Half Gallon Winchester" indicates its capacity and the city that founded this particular system of measurement. There are four different touch marks on the upper rim. In 1795, the government of Lower Canada (now Quebec) ordered four complete sets of weights and measures for the use of the province. Examples of these measures are now held in the Measurement Canada office in Ottawa. Because measures tended to become heavily worn through regular use by inspectors verifying the practices of local tradesmen, the pristine condition of this one is unusual. It is a unique piece of Canadian history, with both functional and aesthetically fascinating attributes.


